

February 14th 1852

The Governor this day issued the following requisition:

State of Maryland - To Whom:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,
To His Excellency, the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly
authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Robert Little was con-
victed at the November term, 1849 of Howard County Court, in the State of Maryland, of the
crime of felony, and, before sentence was passed upon him, he escaped from the jail, and
has been represented to me that he fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge
within the State of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States
in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Robert Little be apprehended
and delivered to Robert H. Bussey who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him
to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name, and the Great Seal
of the State, this fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord One
Thousand eight hundred and fifty two.
