The Governor this day nominated to the Senate the list of Civil Officers for the State and also a list of the Civil Officers for the several Counties including the Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals, the Chief Judges of the Orphan's Courts and Justices of District Courts, likewise Stephen Beard, Sen., as Judge of the Orphan's Court for Anne Arundel County vice Stephens Gambrill, deceased. Also this day the Governor nominated to the Senate the following Military list viz: James H. Watkins of N. as Adjutant General; Thomas Philips 2^d Lieutenant 1st Regiment of Riflemen, attached to 2nd light brigade, Maryland Volunteers, vice D. Constantine, resigned; Alexander Williams 3^d Lieutenant, same company, vice Thomas Philips, promoted, and Zachariah Turner, Ensign, same company, vice Alexander Williams promoted.

The Governor this day sent the following communication to the Senate:
Executive Department Feb. 26th 1852.

To the Senate:

Gentlemen:

The act of 1821, chapter 229, makes it the duty of the Levy Court of Prince George's County, Annually, before the 1st day of February, to recommend one suitable person to the Governor for the Office of Tobacco Inspector at each of the Warehouses in said County.

The Levy Court of that County did not forward to me their recommendation, or, at least it was not received at the Department, until the 14th instant. The list of local appointments having been previously made out, the present Inspectors at those several Warehouses were continued in the absence of the annual recommendation, and, when it was received, the correction of the list was inadvertently omitted. I now, therefore, respectfully ask, that the several nominations, before you, of Messrs. Alfred H. Wells, Elijah Cornick, Daniel Cornick and John S. Lambert be returned, and in accordance with the recommendation of the Levy Court, I respectfully make the following nominations:

For Tobacco Inspector in Prince George's County, at Upper Marlboro, Jeremiah Mulliken; at Nottingham, Henry M. Chew; at Magdoon's Ferry, John L. Turner, and at Piscataway, Samuel Coe.
