The Governor this day sent the following communication to the Senate:

Executive Department, March 18th 1852

To the Senate.

Gentlemen: By the request of Peter Gorman, Esq. of Howard County, I hereby respectfully beg leave to withdraw his nomination as a justice of the peace for the said County, and, also, by the request of Wm. H. Stabb, Esq., I beg leave respectfully to withdraw his nomination as coroner for Eastern Talbot County.

The Governor this day ordered notice to be given in the Upper Marlboro Gazette that application has been made for a Noble Porsegni in behalf of John L. Turner, Clement R. Cornick and George H. Waters who were severally indicted by the Grand Jury of Prince Georges County for opening the ballot in the eighth election district, in said County, on the fifth day of November, 1851, and commenced counting the ballots at half past three or four o'clock, in the evening of said day, contrary to the acts of assembly in such case made and provided - notice to terminate on Saturday the third of April next.

The Governor this day issued the following requisitions
State of Maryland, to wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,
To his Excellency the Governor of Virginia.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Albert St. Doff stands, upon the oath of Wm. H. Ryan of Baltimore City, charged of obtaining under false pretences, goods and merchandise from the firm of Ryan and Wilson, of Baltimore City, amounting to the sum of five hundred and fifty eight dollars and fifty eight cents, and it hath been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and hath taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

Now therefore, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Albert St. Doff be apprehended and delivered to John Zell, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name, and the Great Seal of the State, this twentieth day of March in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty two.
