This day the Governor issued the following requisition:

State of Maryland - To wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe Governor of the State of Maryland,

To His Excellency, the Governor of South Carolina

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain A. Riddle stands charged upon the affadavit of William H. Dorsey, one of the Firm of Brinnell, Knight & Dorsey of the City of Baltimore with the crime of receiving stolen money knowing it to have been stolen, against the form of the act of the General Assembly of this State, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this and has taken refuge within the State of South Carolina.

Now therefore, pursuant to the Constitutional provisions and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said A. Riddle be
