

April 5th 1852

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of John D. Bowling, John B. Brooke Jr. and Wm^r Dwall, Esquires, highly respectable citizens of Prince Georges County, granted Three several Nolle Prosequis in behalf of Clement R. Cornick, George H. Waters and John L. Turner, who are charged by presentment of the Grand Jury of Prince Georges County for opening, on the 5th day of November 1851, the ballot-box in the 8th election District of said County, and commencing counting the ballots at half past three or four o'clock on the evening of said day, contrary to the act of Assembly in such case made and provided.

April 6th 1852

This day the Governor received the report of Alexander Cummings, Inspector of Foreign & Domestic Signers, from the time of his appointment up to the 5th of April 1852.

April 7th 1852

The Governor this day received a message from the Senate informing him that they have advised and consented to the appointment of Thomas C. Ward to be Inspector of Tobacco at Warehouse No. 1., also of Loach L. Means to be Inspector of Tobacco at Warehouse No. 3., also of George W. Hammond to be Inspector of Tobacco No. 2., and of the several Civil Officers for Maryland County agreeably to the nominations of the 25th of February last, except the nominations for Coroners, Justices of the District Courts and Chief Judge of the Orphans Court.

April 9th

This day the Governor, upon the application of J. H. Gordon, States Attorney for Allegany County, tendered to Henry May, Esq. the appointment of assistant Counsel, on the part of the State, in the case of Robert Swann, indicted by the Grand Jury of Allegany County for the Murder of William O. Sprigg.

April 10th 1852 today commissions to some of the State officers were signed seal Book of Executive nomination

April 12th

The Governor this day received a communication from Henry May, Esq. accepting the appointment on the part of the State to aid the States Attorney of Allegany County in the prosecution of Robert Swann for the Murder of William O. Sprigg - The Governor accordingly assigned him as Counsel for that purpose.

April 14th

The Governor this day Commissioned Thomas Price Hobbs, as Register of Mills for Howard County.

April 15th

The Governor this day sent the following nominations to the Senate for their advice and consent viz: Henry H. Owings as Justice of the peace for Howard County, Samuel C. Moran, Benjamin A. Lancaster and John H. Roswell as Justices
