Buckingham, vice Rezin Franklin, declined, as Justice of the peace for Carroll County, Thomas Whalen, vice Francis Dean, deceased, as Justice of the peace for Allegany County, Samuel D. Betton and William H. Barton, vice Andrew Mason, declined, as Justices of the peace for Queen Anne's County and Arthur J. Loveday for Coroner for Talbot County, vice William H. Stahl declined.

Also this day received from the Senate a communication advising and consenting to the appointments severally of certain persons to be Lynagers of Castles and Inspectors of Lignum in Baltimore City, of Charles R. Waters as Inspector of Tobacco at Warehouse No. 5, of Perry G. Etchison as Inspector of Tobacco at Warehouse No. 4, of John C. Polk as Inspector of Lignum in Baltimore City, of the Civil Officers for Washington County except for Chief Judge of the Orphan's Court, of the Civil Officers for Frederick County, except for Chief Judge of the Orphan's Court and Justices of the District Courts, of Oliver D. Wright and Thomas J. Graham as Notaries Public in the City of Baltimore and refused to advise and consent to the appointment severally of Thomas J. Finley and Philip A. Egerton as Notaries Public agreeably to the nominations of the 25th of February last; also advised and consented to the appointments severally of Gassaway Winterson and William H. Peake as Justices of the peace for Anne Arundel County agreeably to the nominations of the 1st of April instant.
