

May 6th 1852.

This day the Governor received from the Clerk to the Commissioners for said St. Mary's County copies of the Bonds given by Elijah J. Abell, John C. Combs, William B. Goodard and John B. Flower Collector of State Taxes for St. Mary's County; Also issued Commissions to Oliver B. Night and Thomas J. Graham, Notaries Public for Baltimore City, &c.

May 7th

The Governor this day remitted a fine of fifty dollars which was imposed by the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, at April Term 1852, upon a certain Thomas Lomas "for selling a half pint of Whiskey."

May 8th

The Governor this day appointed James M. Buchanan and Otto Scott, Esqs., under Resolution No. 12 of January Session 1852, Commissioners to proceed to Pennsylvania to collect all the facts and circumstances connected with the killing of a fugitive slave by Archibald G. Ridgely, a police Officer of Baltimore City, and to report to him.

May 12th

The Governor this day issued the following requisition:
Enoch Louis Lowe Governor of the State of Maryland,
To His Excellency, the Governor of Pennsylvania:

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain John Ingram stands charged upon the oath of Sarah Jane Walls, a citizen of Cecil County in the State of Maryland, of having, on the morning of the 30th day of April last, entered her dwelling house in Cecil County aforesaid, and "forcibly took, robbed and carried away" money and property of the value of three hundred and twenty five dollars, belonging to John, William, and Cornelius Walls, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania:

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said John Ingram be apprehended and delivered to John Lanney, Esq., who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
