The Governor also this day remitted a fine of one hundred dollars, which was imposed upon John Russell by the late Washington County Court, at March Term 1851, for committing "an assault and battery upon the body of Elizabeth Russell."

May 15th

The Governor this day received, from Francis Gallagher, his resignation of the Office of Commissioner of Insolvency Debtors of the City and County of Baltimore.

Also this day received, through the Hon. Richard J. Bowie, a copy of the Report of Commodore Smith, Chief of the Bureau of Docks and Yards, on the comparative value of Anthracite and Bituminous Coals, as generators of steam, transmitted by the Secretary of the Navy, in reply to a series of Resolutions of the General Assembly of Maryland, asking information on that subject.

Also ordered publication in the "Sun" and "Argus" of the Application for a Habeas Corpus in the case of the State of Maryland vs. Charles Franklin, a youth charged with larceny.

Also this day remitted a recognizance which was entered into by William Mayhew, William A. Jarboe and James J. Jarboe in the sum of twenty dollars for the appearance of said William Mayhew before Prince Georges County Court, at November Term 1851 and which as afterwards forfeited.

May 17th

The Governor this day transmitted to the House of Delegates and Senate documents and information in relation to the comparative value of Anthracite and Bituminous Coals, as generators of steam, as furnished by the Secretary of the Navy, in reply to joint Resolutions of the present General Assembly.

The Governor this day, through the Adjutant General, received an inventory of the State's property in the keeping of the Eagle Artillery Company of Baltimore City.

May 19th

This day the Governor sent the following communication to the General Assembly:

To the General Assembly

Gentlemen: - In my Annual Message I informed you of the course which
