

May 22^d 1852

The Governor this day issued his Warrant, to the Sheriff of Baltimore County or City, or to the Sheriff of any other County in the State, for the arrest and delivery of a certain John alias, Joseph Whittaker, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Pennsylvania,

Also this day, upon the recommendation of Bradley J. Johnson, Esq, State Attorney for Frederick County, the Governor granted a Habeas Corpus in behalf of Andrew Conroy who stands charged by presentment of the Grand Jury of the said County, at February Term, 1852, of Burning a Barn.

Also this day issued a Notice for publication in the "Sun", of the application for a Habeas Corpus in the case of the State of Maryland vs John Smith, charged with peddling goods without a license; the said Smith having been recognized by the Justice of the peace as Joseph Smith, for his appearance to answer said charge before the Judge of the Criminal Court for Baltimore City on the 27th inst.

Also this day the Governor remitted a fine of twenty five dollars, which was imposed upon Nicholas Keefer, by the Circuit Court for Washington County, at November Term 1851, for an Assault and Battery upon the body of Agnes Ruth Friend. May 25th Commissioned George F. Madden Notary Public to reside at Leonardtown, Saint Mary's County.

May 26th

The Governor this day refused to remit fines imposed by Justice Pendington, of the City of Baltimore, upon John Horst, H. Bickel and Thomas Graft for violating the Act of 1837, Chapter 313, Section 10, and Supplement of 1841, and May 27th Commissioned John W. E. Ludlow, John Reese and Henry Meade, Coronors for Queen Anne's County.

May 28th

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate the following named gentlemen as Justices of the Peace, viz: for Somerset County, Joshua H. Miles; for Charles County, Joseph D. Harbin; for Anne Arundel County, Richard I. Small and Andrew S. Phelps; for Howard County, W. Howard; for Saint Mary's County, J. H. Harris; for Harford County, Thomas Deamont; for Worcester County, Hardy Bowen; for Allegany County, John White, vice John W. McNeill, declined, and for Charles County, William M. Everett.

Also this day the Governor sent into the Senate a list of nominations for Commissioners to take the Acknowledgments of Deeds and Instruments of writing, under seal, for the State of Maryland, to reside on the several States, therein named - see Book of Executive Nominations for the list in detail.

May 30th

The Governor this day transmitted to the Senators and Representatives of Maryland, in the Congress of the United States, joint Resolutions of the General Assembly, requesting our said Representatives to use their best exertions, to cause a survey to be made, by the General Government, of the Potomack Sound, and the channel between Matt's Island and Fox's Island, and between Potomack Sound and Long's Sound and to apply laws.
