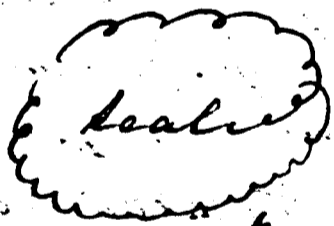

The Governor this day issued the following Proclamation:
State of Maryland, - To Wit:

Whereas it has been represented to me that the Court House and Public Offices, thereto attached, at Cambridge, in Dorchester County, in this State, were fired by an unknown incendiary, or incendiaries, on the night of the day of May last, whereby the public records of the County aforesaid were consumed: And Whereas the said incendiary, or incendiaries, has or have eluded the vigilance of the Officers of the State, and is or are continuing to do so, and has or have fled from its justice, and taken refuge in some other State; and it is of the first importance that he or they should be arrested, and made to suffer the punishment for his heinous offence.

Now Therefore, I, Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of Maryland, at the request of some of the most respectable citizens of said State, do, by this my Proclamation, offer a reward, from the date hereof, of Three Hundred dollars for the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons, by whom the said Arson was committed.

Given under my hand, and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, at the City of Annapolis, this Tenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two.

Also this day, upon the recommendation of Druall, Keighlin & Dorsey, the parties upon whom the larceny was committed, and by Stothower, Matthew & Co., C. Brooks son & Co., Shingluff, Dennis & Co., Nyman, Appleton & Co., Hurst & Berry, Lynnell & Jenkins, Cushing & Daley, Wm Woodward & Co., James Harvey, Bevan & Dunham, King, Carey & Howe, Long & Payne, Joshua Vansant, B. H. Richardson, L. W. Gosnell, Langston & Co., Charles H. Pitts, Robert J. Mrent, and Comfort Tiffany, the Governor granted a Noble Prosequi in behalf of Charles Franklin, who stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of Baltimore City with Felony (Larceny) upon condition that the said Charles Franklin do immediately leave the State of Maryland and never return again within its borders.
