July 3<sup>d</sup>

The Governor this day remitted a fine of fifty dollars imposed upon Noah Bayton by Dorchester County Court, at October Term 1851, for catching Oysters with scoop or dredge in the waters of said County. July 1<sup>st</sup> Commissioned George B. Lytle Justice of the Peace for Anne Arundel County.

Also this day remitted six several fines of Ten dollars each imposed, by Anne Arundel County upon Robert Welch of Ken, by Anne Arundel County at April Term 1851, for non-appearance of a certain William A. Woodall upon a return of "Capi", for non-appearance of a certain Richard J. Layman and John B. Stallings, for non-appearance of a certain Henry Drake, for non-appearance of a certain John B. Watts, for non-appearance of a certain Roubly Thomas, and for the non-appearance of a certain Thomas Crown upon returns of "Capi".

Also this day the Governor issued the following communication to the Adjutant General.

July 7<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day remitted a fine of twenty dollars imposed upon John Hartman, by the Circuit Court for Allegany County, at April Term, 1852, for selling liquor without on the sabbath day. July 8<sup>th</sup> also this day commissioned sundry persons as Commissioners to take Acknowledgment of deeds &c. - See Book of Appointments.

July 9<sup>th</sup>

This day the Governor refused to grant to Mrs. Billingsley & John A. Cox of Calverton County, the Remission of a forfeited recognizance.
