July 13th

The Governor this day received the report of Thomas J. Welch, Inspector of Signers, for the half year ending July 1st 1852. July 14th 1852 Commissioned Alexander B. Hanson, Commissioner for the erection of an Insane Hospital, via Richd. Potts, resigned.

July 15th

The Governor Commissioned Andrew Orr, Notary Public to reside at Port Deposit in Cecil County.

Also Commissioned certain persons for Military positions - see Book of appointments.

July 23^d

This day the Governor issued Military Commissions to sundry persons - see Book of Appointments. Also Commissioned John Gebhart, Justice of the Peace for Allegany County, via Mr. Knost, resigned.

July 24th

The Governor this day gave Notice, for publication in the "Sun" & "Argus", of the application being made for the pardon of a certain George M. Martin, who was convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore City, at the May term 1852, for indecent exposure of his person, and sentenced to be fined one hundred dollars and to be imprisoned sixty days.

July 26th

The Governor dismissed the application of Thomas W. Graves for pardon, he being a convict in the Penitentiary.

Also dismissed the application of Francis Metz, a convict in the Penitentiary, for pardon.

July 28th

The Governor this day Commissioned Garrett Osborn, Inspector of Scurbs in the City of Baltimore, vice Andrew Sumwalt, deceased.
