August 9<sup>th</sup>

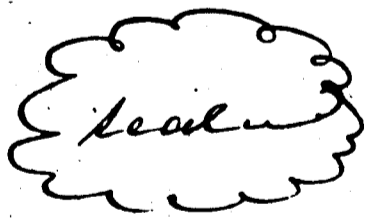
This day the Governor issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Carroll County, under a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania, for the arrest and delivery of Jacob Lingon or Lyon, a fugitive from the justice of said State.

August 12<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day received the following communication from the Honorable Alexander H. Stewart, Secretary of the Interior, to wit:

I, Alexander H. Stewart, Secretary of the Interior, do hereby certify, that in discharge of the duty devolved on me by the provisions of an Act of Congress approved May 23<sup>d</sup>, 1850, entitled "An Act providing for the taking of the seventh and subsequent Censuses of the United States, and to fix the Number of the Members of the House of Representatives, and provide for their future apportionment among the several States," and in pursuance of the provisions of another Act of Congress, approved 30<sup>th</sup> of July, 1852, entitled "An Act supplementary to 'An Act providing for the taking of the seventh and subsequent censuses of the United States, and to fix the Number of Members of the House of Representatives, and provide for their future apportionment among the several States,' approved twenty-third May, eighteen hundred and fifty," I have apportioned the Representatives among the several States, as provided for by said acts, in the manner directed by the 25<sup>th</sup> section of the act approved 23<sup>d</sup> May 1850, and the 1<sup>st</sup> section of the act approved 30<sup>th</sup> July 1852.

And I do hereby further certify, that the Number of Representatives apportioned to the State of Maryland under the last or seventh enumeration of the inhabitants of the United States is six (6)
