Bell an offence with intent to commit murder, against the Act of Assembly, of Maryland, in such case made and provided, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Delaware.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said William H. Bell be apprehended and delivered to John Allen, who is authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to laws.
