

September 3^d 1852

The Governor this day, remitted a fine of Ten dollars & imposed upon John Leigh, by Simon Kemp, Esq., a Justice of the peace for Baltimore City, for selling without a license in violation of the 2^d section of the Act of Assembly, passed the 20th of February 1841.

September 14th

This day the Governor issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore City for the delivery of a certain James W. Boston, who is demanded, under a requisition, from the Governor of Pennsylvania, as a fugitive from the justice of the said State.

September 20th

The Governor this day ordered notice to be given in the "Weekly Sun" and in the "State Capital Gazette" of the application made, by a number of highly respectable citizens of Calvert County, for a State Prosequi in behalf of a certain Clement Harrison, who at the last May Term of the Circuit Court for Calvert County, was presented by the Grand Jury for having harbored a negro slave, the property of one Benjamin K. Talbot.

September 25th

The Governor this day ordered publication to be made in the "Sun" and "Argus" that application has been filed for the pardon of a certain John Evans, who was convicted at the May Term, 1852, of the Criminal Court for Baltimore City of an assault with intent to kill a certain Stephen Inry. Also commissioned George L. Harrison as Auctioneer for the City of Baltimore, vice William G. Harrison, neglected to take out his commission.

September 29th

This day the Governor, under a requisition from the Governor of Pennsylvania, issued his Warrant, to the Sheriff of Cecil County, for the arrest and delivery, to Dornier Darrington, the agent of Pennsylvania, a certain Robert Mackey, who is charged of being a fugitive from the justice of said State.

October 1st 1852

The Governor this day received and filed a copy of the Official Bond of Levin Woolford, as Clerk of the Circuit Court for Somerset County; also a copy of the Official bond of Samuel W. Jones, as Register of Wills for said County and also a copy of the Official bond of Samuel S. Boggs, as Sheriff of said County.

October 11th

This day the Governor order notice to be given in the "State Capital Gazette", "Cambridge Democrat" and "Denton Journal", that application has been made for the pardon of a certain Edward W. Faulkner, who was indicted in the Circuit Court for Caroline County for an assault with intent to kill a certain Stephen Cooper, and upon removal of the case to the Circuit Court for Dorchester County was therein, at the April term 1852, convicted and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary House of the State of Maryland.
