

October 11<sup>th</sup> 1852

The Governor this day issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Washington County for the arrest and delivery of a certain John, alias Leonard Witter, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Pennsylvania.

Also this day issued the following Death Warrant:  
The State of Maryland,

To the Sheriff of Howard County, Greeting.

Whereas David Green, alias, David Wilson (free Negro) late of Howard County, was convicted in the Circuit Court for Howard County, at September Term 1852, of the crime of committing a rape upon the person of Margaret Jane Leach, against the peace, dignity and good government of the State, and the said Court sentenced him to be hung by the neck until he be dead.

Now therefore, these are to will and require, as also to charge and command you, that between the hour of 11 O'clock A. M. and one O'clock P. M. on Friday the nineteenth day of November next, you take the said David Green, alias, David Wilson, from your prison, and him safely convey to the gallows in the County aforesaid, the place of the execution of Malefactor, and there the said David Green, alias, David Wilson hang by the neck until he be dead: For all which this shall be your sufficient power and Authority.

Given under my hand, and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, this eleventh day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty two, and of the Independence of the United States, the seventy seventh.
