

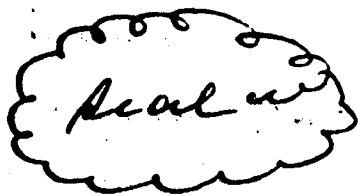
November 1st 1852

The Governor this day issued the following requisition:
State of Maryland - To wit:

Enoch Louis Lowe, Governor of the State of Maryland,
To His Excellency, the Governor of the State of Georgia;

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain W. J. Morgan stands charged, on the oath of John B. Cannon with having feloniously abducted and carried away a certain negro slave named "Walter", the property of the said John B. Cannon, with the purpose of stealing the said slave, against the form of the act of the General Assembly of this State in such case made and provided; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of Georgia.

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said W. J. Morgan be apprehended and delivered to John R. Quinn and Archibald G. Ridgely, or either of them, who are hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.



In Witness whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name, and the Great Seal of the State, this first day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty two.

November 5th

The Governor this day ordered a Notice to be published in the "Alleghenian" of an application being made for the pardon of a certain William Hays, who was convicted on two several indictments for larceny, in the Circuit Court for Allegany County, at the October Term 1852, and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary until the 2^d day of April 1856. The Governor refused, this day, the Application of Michael Sullivan for a pardon.

November 15th

The Governor this day, upon the recommendation of States Attorney, Geo. T. Denny and others, remitted a fine of fifty dollars, which was imposed upon Edmund Taylor by the Circuit Court for Howard County, at September Term 1852, for suffering a negro slave the property of a certain John R. Brown, on one or two occasions, to be in his storehouse between the hours of sunset and sunrise contrary to the act of Assembly of 1817 chapter in such case made and provided.
