The Governor this day issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Baltimore City and County to
deliver to William W. Rock, the agent appointed under a requisition from the Governor of Virginia,
Samuel Burns and Patrick Burke, now in your custody, who stand charged with feloniously kid-
napping a certain Jane Armbray, a free person, with intent to sell and sell her as a slave.

Also this day appointed and Commissioned Alexander Maxwell, Justice of the Peace
for Baltimore County, vice Edward Kelly, failed to qualify.

December 1st 1852

The Governor this day transmitted to the Presidential Electoral College, which assem-
bled in the Senate Chamber for the purpose of casting the vote of the State of Maryland
for President and Vice President of the United States, three Certificates of the election of
the members of the Electoral College, which certificates were in the following words.

State of Maryland, To Wit:

In obedience to an Act of Congress, approved
the first day of March, one thousand seven hundred and ninety two, Chapter
Eight, and a supplement thereto, approved the twenty sixth day of March, one
thousand eight hundred and four, Chapter 50, I do hereby certify that Robert M.
McLane, Cathel Humphreys, John Parran, Richard H. Ahmy, Carroll Spence, Charles
J. M. Gwin, Joseph A. Wickes and Ephraim K. Willson, were duly elected Elec-
tors of President and Vice President of the United States, for the State of Maryland,
at the Election held on the second day of November, one thousand eight hun-
dred and fifty two.
