

Authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain John Richard, late of Cecil County in this State, stands charged, upon the oath of Andrew Lamb, duly made before a Justice of the peace, of the crime of aiding and assisting, on the evening of the 21st of November last, in the murder of a certain Maria Richard, also late of Cecil County, aforesaid, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania:

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said John Richard be apprehended and delivered to John Larnsey, Esq. who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

The Governor, upon application made by James Higgins, State Agricultural Chemist, this day authorized an extension of time to the 23rd instant for the said Agricultural Chemist to continue his operations in Washington County.

December 7th

This day the Governor remitted a fine of fifty dollars, which was imposed upon Levin Gardner by the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, at October term 1852; for committing an assault and battery on a certain Joseph T. Richardson the said remission having been recommended by a number of highly respectable citizens of said County.

December 7th

The Governor this day issued Commissions to a number of Military officers - see Book of Executive appointments.

December 10th

This day the Governor issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Washington County for the arrest of a certain Jacob Devere who stands charged, by indictment in the Court of Quarter Sessions, held in and for the County of Bedford, in the State of Pennsylvania, with the crime of Larceny, committed in said County.

December 16th

The Governor this day appointed and commissioned Samuel G. Spicer Justice of the peace for the first district of Baltimore City viz Child, deceased
