The Governor transmitted to the Senate for advice and consent, the names of the following gentlemen as Managers of the House of Refuge for Juvenile Delinquents: Solomon Hillier Jr., Thomas Yates Walsh, Joseph Weather, Jacob G. Davies, Alexander Fisher, B. H. Richardson Joshua J. Cohen and James Gilmore.

Also, certain nominations for Commissioners to take the acknowledgment of deeds, &c. out of this State.

25<sup>th</sup>.

The Governor directed a notice of two several applications for a Nolle Prosequi in favor of John Hagan and Ormond Hammond, indicted at November Term 1852, of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, for betting on the result of a certain election held on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November 1852, to be published in the "Frederick Citizen"; notice to expire on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of March, proximo.

Also, directed a notice of four several applications for a Nolle Prosequi in favor of John Capidy, James Smith, Samuel Hambleton and Alexander Dunlop, charged upon the oath of William Bryan, Deputy Sheriff of Anne Arundel County, with having resisted him in the discharge of his duties, to be published in the "State Capitol Gazette"; notice to expire on 28<sup>th</sup> instant.

25<sup>th</sup>.

The Governor was officially informed by J. Pintney, Esquire, Secretary of the Senate, that that Body had advised and consent severally to the nominations made upon the 19<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>d</sup>, and 23<sup>d</sup> instant.

28<sup>th</sup>.
