

March 2^d 1853.

The Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi in favor of John Capidy, charged with resisting the Sheriff of Anne Arundel County in the discharge of his duty. See Record of Parsons.

3^d.

The Governor directed a notice of an application for a Nolle Prosequi in favor of Ernest Augustus Bechtel, indicted by the Grand Jury for the County of Montgomery, for the misdemeanor of forcible entry and detainer, to be published in the "Rockville Journal" and "State Capitol Gazette"; to expire on the 24th instant.

Also directed a notice of an application for the pardon of a certain Charles Carroll, convicted of Larceny at the January Term 1853 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore City, to be published in the "Baltimore Sun" and "Argus", and in the "State Capitol Gazette"; to expire on the 24th instant.

7th.

The Governor remitted the recognizance entered into by Papmore M. Cullough for the appearance of a certain John Idings before the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County at October Term 1852, and forfeited to the amount of seventy five dollars.

Also, the recognizance entered into by John M. Davis for the same and forfeited to the amount of seventy five dollars.

7th.

The transmitted to the General Assembly copies of a correspondence between His Excellency and Major James Lowry Donaldson concerning resolution of the General Assembly tendering to him the thanks of the State of Maryland for gallant conduct during the Florida and Mexican Wars.
