The Governor received from J. Pinkney, Esquire, Secretary of the Senate, official information that the Senate had confirmed the nominations severally of the 23^d of February previous and March 10th instant.

19th.

The Governor issued a *Writ Prosequi* in favor of John Hagan and Ormond W. Hammond, presented by the Grand Jury of Frederick County, at the November Term 1852 of the Circuit Court thereof, severally, for making a bet and wager on the result of an election to take place on the 5th of November 1852.

19th.

The Governor received official information from the Secretary of the Senate that that Body had advised and consented to the appointment of George F. Hornor to be Auctioneer for Baltimore City.

The Governor sent to the Senate the following nominations: Robt. L. Ford to be Commissioner of deeds &c. to reside at Columbus, Colorado County, Texas; James Sinclair for same to reside at Leesburg, Loudon County, Virginia; and William F. Harsham, to reside in the City of New York.
