

29th.

The Governor received official information that the Senate had advised and consented to the nominations severally of the 23^d. & 25th. of March.

30th.

The Governor issued a commission to Daniel Slides as Commissioner of deeds &c. to reside in New York.

The Governor nominated to the Senate for its advice and consent J. W. P. Huntington, as Commissioner of deeds &c. to reside in Oregon Territory.

31st.

The Governor received official information that the Senate had advised and consented to the appointments severally of the 2^d, 14th & 22^d. of February and of the 30th. of March.

April 5th 1853.

The Governor nominated W^m A. Disney, Justice of the Peace for Baltimore County, vice A. P. Shutt resigned.

7th.

The Governor was informed by Judge Crain that the State's Attorney for Prince George's County was unfitted by sickness to attend to the State's interest before the Circuit Court thereof, and requested the Governor to assign counsel; whereupon the Governor assigned Fredk. Stone, Esquire, of Charles County.

The Governor acknowledged the receipt of an invitation from the Legislature of Pennsylvania that the General Assembly and Departments of Government of Maryland pay the State of Pennsylvania a visit, and transmitted said invitation to the General Assembly and Heads of Department.

8th.

The Governor transmitted to the General Assembly the following Message:
