31st.

The Governor refused to remit a fine of one hundred dollars imposed on Benj. Lancaster, by the Circuit Court for Washington County, for selling liquor within two miles of the College of St. James, as provided in the act of 1846.

The Governor directed notice of application for a Habeas Corpus in favor of James Adams, charged with selling goods without a license in violation of the laws relating to Hawkers & Peddlers, to be published; to expire the 9th. instant.

The Governor remitted a fine of one hundred dollars imposed of Paphrose McCullough, by the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County at October Term 1853, for "offering to pay M. A. Clerk, fifty dollars, if she would absent herself from Court, so as not to testify against Richard Lydings"; said remission being petitioned by James Murray, W. E. Bateman, G. M. Duvall, Thomas E. Martin, Wm. Harwood, G. S. Riley, W. A. Spencer, J. E. Tate, John Walton, John Wilmet, B. T. B. Worthington, Alexander Randall, J. H. Sglehart, J. Pinkney, Walter M. New, Richard C. Macchubbin, and H. M. Murray Esquires.
