

The Gov. assigned Charles J. M. Swinner Esq Counsel  
for the State in the matter of the State vs  
Mister on error to Court of Appeals of this  
State vice Amos N. May, appointed by the late  
Gov E. Louis Loring, declined.

March 9<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Governor assigned W. H. W. Bowie Esq Counsel on  
behalf of the State vs Benjamin J. Gardner in  
the Circuit Court for Prince Georges Co.

The Gov. issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of  
Baltimore City, or that of any County, within the  
County may be found, requiring him to arrest  
one P. M. Hall, a fugitive from Justice charged  
with obtaining goods under false pretences,  
and to deliver him to John L. Hamrick Agent  
of the State of Pennsylvania under a Requisition.

The Gov. this day issued a Requisition in the  
usual form upon the Governor of the  
State of Pennsylvania for Richard Bapett  
and Christopher Hughes charged upon indictment  
in the Criminal Court for Baltimore City with  
wilful and corrupt Forgery, requesting him  
to deliver the said Bapett and Hughes to  
John Graham the States Agent in that behalf.

March 16<sup>th</sup> 1854.

The Governor directed notice in the matter  
of the Application for the Pardon of John  
W. Holland convicted at New Term 1853 of the  
Circuit Court for Montgomery County, of an Assault  
and Battery on Charles Mobley and sentenced  
to be confined in the County Jail twelve months.
