The Governor this day directed Notice of application for a Writ of Habeas Corpus in favor of Major John Washington the property of Charlotte M. Patten of Talbot County, charged with being off part of the tax of Major John

April 25th

The Governor this day pardoned James Dowley and James Delaney convicted, of Larceny, 2^d May 1853 in the Circuit Court for Harford County and sentenced to undergo a confinement in the Penitentiary of this state until the 1st day of June 1855.

The Governor this pardoned John H. Holland convicted, at the November Term 1853 of the Circuit Court for Montgomery County, of an assault and battery on Clark Mobley and sentenced to be confined in the County Jail twelve months.

The Governor this day directed the usual Notice in the matter of the application for the Pardon of John H. Maloney, convicted, at March Term 1854, of the Circuit Court for Caroline County, of having stolen one Bay Mare, and adjudged to undergo confinement in the Penitentiary for two years from the 18th March 1854.

The Governor this day appointed and Commissioned Samuel Northampton of John Aid de Camps to his Excellency with the Rank of Colonel.
