

Nov. 17th 1855.

The Governor this day issued his Warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany County for the execution of one Frederick Miller, convicted in the Circuit Court for said County at its October Term 1855 of Murder in the First Degree. Said execution to take place on Friday the 4th day of January in the year 1856. Also before the house of one John P. G.

Same day the Governor assigned B. L. Goldsborough Esq. Counsel on the part of the State to aid in the prosecution of the Murderer or Murderers of John P. Bradshaw in the town of Cambridge in this State on or about the 26th June last, before the Circuit Court for Frederick County, to which Court said cause was removed from that for Talbot County.

Same day the Governor pardoned Ellen Howard, convicted October Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County of Petty Larceny, upon condition that she leave the State and never return again thereto.

same day the Governor directed publication of Notice of Application having been made for the pardon of Isaac D. Row, convicted October Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County of Burglary. Notice sent to "Citizen" and "Union" of Frederick City for publications. Case to be considered on or after Monday 10th Dec. 1855.
