

The Governor this day granted a Pardon to George W. Frick of said
County of said County, convicted with accessories of
the crime of 2275.57 the husband of the
said woman and Frick.

June 21st

The Governor this day granted a Pardon to Charles Gentle
convicted April Term 1856 of the Circuit Court for Anne
Arundel County of an Assault with a Dangerous Weapon, and
sentenced to imprisonment in the Public Jail of the
County aforesaid for the term of three months.

Same day the Governor issued his two several
Warrants, directed to the Sheriff of Worcester County,
for the execution of Jim Mills and Littleton Lewis
Jury Negroes, convicted May Term 1856 of the Circuit
Court of the County aforesaid of the crime of Rape and
sentenced to be hung by the neck until they be dead.

Same day the Governor refused to grant a
Writ Habeas Corpus to Thomas T. Wilson indicted in the
Circuit Court for Rochester County for Manslaughter.

June 22nd

The Governor this day issued his Warrant, upon
the Requisition of the Governor of the State of Ohio,
directed to any Sheriff in this State, for the arrest
and delivery to John Beckler, Agent of the State of
Ohio in that behalf, of a certain Joseph D. Price
a fugitive from Justice charged with the crime
of embezzlement.

23rd

The Gov. this day appointed and commissioned
Jacob Brown, Joshua Murren and Henry Smith
to view and examine a Turnpike Road from the
square in the town of Broomfield in Washington
County to Jennings Ferry on the Potomac River and to report
in writing whether the said Road is so far extended in
a suitable and convenient manner according to the true
intent and meaning of the Act of 1844 ch. 71.
