

Same day the Governor directed publication of Notice of Application having been made to him for the Pardon of Richard Thompson who was convicted January Term 1855 of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of receiving stolen goods knowing them to have been stolen was sentenced to two years and six months in the Penitentiary. Case to be considered on or after the 14th July next.

July 1st 1856

The Governor this day issued his Proclamation offering a Reward of Two hundred dollars for the arrest and delivery to the Sheriff of Kent County or the arrest and detention in any other State to await his Requisition, or the use may be, of the persons or persons guilty of the killing of George Mansant, recently murdered within the body of Kent County. The said Reward to be paid on conviction.

Same day the Governor issued his Order to the Adjutant General of the State directing him to have the National Flag displayed from the Stables of the State House on the 4th inst. and the usual salutes fired in commemoration of the Anniversary of American Independence.

Same day the Governor received from the Adjutant General a communication stating that Lt. A. R. Weston had reported to his Office that the Mount Vernon Guards of the 53^d Regt. under his command having failed to make two successive forades and two successive returns is disbanded under the Act of 1853. Whereupon, as required by the provisions of the said Act the Governor revoked and annulled the commissions of the Officers of the said Corps.
