

Jan. 29th 1857.

The Governor this day assigned Hon. John Nelson and John W. L. McArthur Counsel on the part of the state in the matter of the proposed extra dividend of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Co. See copy of Letters sent them recorded in correspondence Book.

Jan. 30th

The Governor this day granted a Pardon to George W. Price convicted Nov. Term 1855 of the Circuit Court of the County of Two dollars and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for one year and seven months from the 15th Dec. 1855. See Record of Pardons.

Jan 31st

The Governor this day received the Sixth Annual Report of the Managers of the House of Refuge.

Feb. 2^d

The Governor this day directed publication of Notice that application has been made to him for the Pardon of James M. Jenkins, convicted at the January Term 1857 of the Circuit Court for Talbot County, of Larceny. To be considered on or after 23^d inst.

Same day the Governor granted a Pardon to Henry Selby, convicted at the February Term 1855 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County of Larceny of a Hatch and Chain and sentenced to the Penitentiary for two years and three months. See Pardon Records.
