against the Peace Government and dignity of the  
State. The foregoing Requisition is to be executed without  
cost in the State unless the accused shall be  
brought into the State, tried and convicted.

March 19<sup>th</sup> 1857.

The Governor this day approved the official Bond  
of William Gandy, Assistant Inspector of Flour in  
the City of Baltimore.

March 20.

The Governor this remitted a Fine of \$50. imposed  
upon one George Sands, a free negro, by the Circuit  
Court for Frederick County for selling liquor  
without license in less quantities than one pint.

March 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The Governor this day issued his Requisition  
upon the Governor of the State of New York for the  
arrest and delivery to Madison Jeffers and William  
Snyder, Agents of this State in that behalf, of a  
certain George Kubin and a certain Lewis Ware  
charged by Indictment in the Criminal Court of Balti-  
more at its January Term 1857 with the larceny of  
four seven gold watches each of the value of thirty  
eight dollars of the goods and chattels of one Daniel  
H. Dorsey.

Same day the Governor granted a Pardon  
to Frederick Buff, convicted at the May Term 1854  
of the Criminal Court of Baltimore of receiving  
stolen goods. See Record of Pardons.

Same day the Governor directed publication  
of Notice that Application has been made to  
him for a Writ Habeas Corpus in State vs. Joseph Little  
indicted in the Circuit Court for Frederick County  
Oct. Term 1856 for voting and passing counterfeit  
Coin. To be considered on or after 13<sup>th</sup> April 1857.
