

March 24. 1857.

The Governor this day issued his Requisition upon the Governor of the State of Indiana for the arrest and delivery to Agent of this State in that behalf, of a certain George M. Bush charged by indictment in the Criminal Court of Baltimore with having obtained, by means of a certain false pretence, of Richard A. Harris, Samuel Harris, Thomas B. Harris and Henry M. Harris certain valuable securities, to wit, three Bank Notes each of the value of One hundred dollars; Six Bank Notes each of the value of ten dollars, of the valuable securities and property of the persons above named with intent to defraud and cheat the said.

Same day the Governor gave Notice of Application having been made to him for the Pardon of William A. Hatfield, convicted Feb. Term 1857 of the Circuit Court for Frederick County of Bastardy. To be considered on or after Monday 13th April 1857.

Same day the Governor issued his Warrant directed to any Sheriff in the State for the arrest and delivery to Jefferson McCullough (Agent of the State of Pennsylvania in that behalf appointed by the Gov. of that State and upon whose Requisition the said Warrant issued) of a certain Blythe, charged with Larceny.

Same day the Governor refused to grant a Nolle Prosequi in the matter of the State vs John G. Poston indicted at the October Term 1856 of the Circuit Court for Kent County on a charge of suffering and allowing cards and other unlawful games to be played in his house.
