

April 15th 1857.

The Governor this day, upon the Requisition of the Governor of the State of Virginia, issued his Warrant, directed to the Sheriff of Baltimore City, for the arrest and delivery to Joseph P. Ogelt, agent of State of Virginia in that behalf, of a certain William Wentworth, or fugitive from justice charged with Grand Larceny.

April 18th

The Governor this day issued his Requisition upon the Governor of the State of Delaware for the arrest and delivery to George M. Hearn, agent of this State in that behalf, of a certain Cyrus Brady charged by indictment in the Circuit Court for Dorchester County, with the crime of having fraudulently and unlawfully with force and arms at the County aforesaid, arrested and a certain free Negro Man named Levin Matthews, alias Levin Vincent with intent to have him the said Levin Matthews, alias Levin Vincent carried out of this State contrary to Law &c. &c.

April 20th

The Governor this day remitted a fine of fifty dollars imposed upon one Thomas Calk by the Circuit Court for Washington County at its March Term 1857 for selling liquor without license.

Same day the Governor issued his Requisition upon the Hon. the Chief Justice of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia for the arrest and delivery to Lewis Logan, agent of this State in that behalf, of a certain Charles Hoffman charged upon the affidavit of John D. Wile, with Assault and Larceny, committed in Frederick County in the month of April 1857.
