

April 21-1857.

The Governor this day granted a *Nolle Prosequi* in the case of State vs. Joseph Little, charged by presentment of the Grand Jury of Frederick County with uttering counterfeit coin. See Record.

Same day the Governor approved the Resolutions of the Board of Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary authorizing the office of Corresponding Secretary and Clerk to the Board. See Record.

Same day the Governor directed the Attorney General to be notified in the matter of the Application for the pardon of Michael O'Neal (see entry of 9th inst) to be admitted in the City of Baltimore there being no newspapers published in Howard County and postponed the time for its consideration into the 13th day of May 1857.

23rd 1857

The Governor this day directed Notice to be given of application having been made to him for a *Nolle Prosequi* in the matter of the State vs John Bond, under presentment for larceny made March Term 1857 of the Circuit Court for St. Marys County to be considered on or after May 18th 1857.

April 24th

The Governor this admitted the fine of \$10. imposed upon a certain Charles Mattinger by the Circuit Court for Howard County at its March Term 1852 for selling liquor without License.

April 29th

The Governor this day, upon the Requisition of the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania, issued his Warrant, directed to the Sheriff of Baltimore City, for the arrest and delivery to Edward H. Corbin, agent of that State in
