

June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1857 (continued)

The Governor also gave notice in "his Executive Order" of application for a Writ Habeas Corpus in case of John W. Brown convicted of some stealing in the Circuit Court for Frederick County - to be considered on or after Friday the 26<sup>th</sup> June 1857.

Same day the Governor granted a Writ Habeas Corpus to Francis J. A. Johnson and his wife in the Circuit Court for Frederick County at its Oct. Term 1856 of an assault with intent to kill - see Record & Pardon.

Same day the Governor granted a pardon to Henry Weeks slave of W. Robert Garrison convicted in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County at its May Term 1857 of being guilty of taking the great house of the Quaker of the Par. of Queen Anne's County by stealing therefrom - upon the condition that the said Henry Weeks slave as aforesaid be forthwith sold by his owner & transported beyond the limits of the State & never return thereto - see Record & Pardon.

Same day the Governor also granted pardons to Thomas Isaac slave of John C. Chapman and to Elijah Wilson slave of W. Robert Garrison convicted in the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's County for "breaking the great house at the Almshouse and stealing therefrom" upon the condition that the said Thomas Isaac and Elijah Wilson slaves as aforesaid be forthwith sold by their respective owners & transported beyond the limits of the State, and never return thereto. See Record & Pardon. Pardons to the said Henry Weeks, Thomas Isaac & Elijah Wilson granted to the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Queen Anne's Co.

June 9<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day directed notice to be given in the "Sun" and "Republican" of application for the pardon of Joseph Nichols convicted of an assault in the Criminal Court of Baltimore - to be considered on or after the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 1857.

June 13<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day issued the following Proclamation:

State of Maryland, To Wit:

Whereas it has been represented to me that a most wicked and atrocious murder was committed in Anne Arundel County on the farm of Philip H. Conover Esq. near the Palmyra (Methodist) Church, and about one mile from the said Church, upon the body of a certain John Joseph Myster by some person or persons unknown;

And whereas the said Myster or Myster have evaded the vigilance of the Officers of the said Anne Arundel County at large.
