June 16th 1857

The Governor this day remitted a Fine of Fifty dollars imposed
upon Michael O'Neal in the Circuit Court for Howard County at its
March Term 1857 for an assault upon a negro man

Same day the Governor assigned J. North Steele Esq. Counsel on the
part of the State of Maryland in the matter of the State vs. Batts, Chesapeake
Co. now pending in the Court of Appeals of this State.

June 17th 1857

The Governor this day assigned C. J. Mc. Ginn Esq. Counsel to secure
and protect the interests of the State in the following named cases now pending
in the Court of Appeals of Maryland, Viz: State vs. Mayor & City Council
of Baltimore vs. Howard, Smith & Turner; Howard, Smith & Turner vs. State and Mayor
& City Council of Baltimore; and State vs. Mayor and City Council of Baltimore vs.
Howard, Smith, Turner & Watkins.

Same day the Governor remitted a Fine of Twenty Five dollars im-
posed upon David Hites for selling in Harford County, a pair of hams without
license.

June 18th

This day the Governor granted a Writ Habeas Corpus to David, Negro Slave of James
Overs, charged upon affidavit with the crime of horse stealing committed in Anne
Arundel County upon the condition that the said David, Negro Slave as aforesaid
be sold by his owner and transported beyond the limits of the State of Maryland
and never return there. See Record of W. doers.
