The State of Maryland Let

To the Sheriff of Carroll County Greeting

Whereas Francis T Davis a Senator of the State of Maryland for Carroll County has communicated in writing to the Governor his resignation as Senator aforesaid, and whereas the Constitution of this State provides that in case of the resignation of a Senator during the Legislature recess a warrant of Election shall be issued by the Governor for the election of another person in his place,

Now therefore I Thomas Watkins Ligon Governor of Maryland do by virtue of authority in me vested by the Constitution of that State of Maryland hereby order and direct that an election for Senator of the State aforesaid for Carroll County be held at the places designated by law on the day of the next ensuing election for Delegates to supply the vacancy created by the resignation of the said Francis T Davis and that you the Sheriff of Carroll County do give notice thereof at least ten days exclusive of the day of the publication of the notice and of the day of election, for all which this shall be your sufficient warrant;

In Witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed the Great Seal of the State of Maryland this tenth day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and fifty seven.
