November 7th

The Governor directed notice to be given that application had been made to him for the pardon of Henry O'Neal convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore at January Term 1856 of larceny and sentenced to the Penitentiary until the 30th of June 1858.

The Governor remitted the fines of fifty dollars which were imposed upon James Brannock and Thomas Vickers by the Circuit Court for Dorchester County at July Term 1857.

November 12th

The Governor this day directed notice to be given that application had been made to him for a Nolle Prosequi in the case of the State vs Charles L. Gowen indicted in the Circuit Court for Worcester County at October Term 1857 for an assault with intent to kill and murder Thomas H. Collins.
