The Governor remitted the fine of ten dollars which was imposed upon G. C. Patterson by the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County at April Term 1857 for obstructing the Public Road

The Governor issued his proclamation offering a reward of two hundred dollars for the apprehension and delivery of Richard A. Hawood charged with the murder of John Johnson the slave of Mrs Mary Clayton to the Sheriff of Anne Arundel County.

December 16<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day remitted the fine of fifty dollars imposed upon Ignatius Waters by the Circuit Court for Howard County at March Term 1855 for an assault and battery on A. E. Walkman,

Also remitted the recognizance which was entered into by Thomas Anderson and James C. Anderson on the 21<sup>st</sup> of July 1857 in the sum of One hundred dollars each for the appearance of Thomas Anderson before James Graves Esq a justice of the Peace for Kent County

December 18<sup>th</sup>

The Governor this day granted a Nolle Prosequi to Francis M. Sellman indicted in the Circuit Court for Frederick County at October Term 1856 for arson

The Governor this day granted a pardon to Michael Murphy convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore at May Term 1854 of Larceny
