Proceedings of the Executive Department of

Thomas W. Vicks, Governor.

June 1st.

The Governor directed notice to be given of an application for a nolle prosequi in the case of the State vs. Edwin L. Thomas, indicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore City, at November Term, 1861.

On the same day, the Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi to Lloyd Lowndes, late of Talbot County, charged with committing an assault with intent to kill a certain Thomas Gale.

June 3rd.
