On the same day the Governor issued a Requisition upon the Judge of the Criminal Court for Washington city, D. C., for the delivery to Thomas J. Halley of a free negro named Enoch Ridgely, who is charged with enticing a slave to run away from his master.

June 28th.

The Governor issued certificates of their election to the Members of Congress elected on the 13th instant, and duly complied with the provisions of law in the premises.

June 29th.

The Governor pardoned Thomas Trade, convicted, in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county, of an assault with intent to kill, and sentenced to the county jail for the period of twelve months.

July 2nd.

The Governor pardoned Charles W. Washington, convicted in the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, at March Term, 1857, for obtaining money under false pretenses, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for four years and four months.
