July 5th.

The Governor directed notice to be given of application for Pardon in the case of the State vs. James Logan, convicted in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county at October Term, 1860, and sentenced to the jail of Baltimore city for ten years.

July 10th.

The Governor directed notice to be given of application for Pardon in the case of J. Michael Frank, convicted in the Circuit Court for Frederick county, at February Term, 1854, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of ten years and five months.

July 11th.

The Governor directed notice to be given of application for Pardon in the case of the State vs. Frederick Sumwalt, convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, at January Term, 1861, and sentenced to eighteen months confinement in jail.

July 27th.

The Governor pardoned John Price, convicted, at October Term, 1849, of the County Court for Anne Arundel county, of Murder in the second degree, and sentenced to be confined in the Penitentiary for the period of fourteen years and six months.
