

1861.

Seventy five dollars imposed upon Joseph Thompson, by Charles Hiss, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for the city of Baltimore, for the offense of selling goods without license

August 15th.

The Governor pardoned Jacob Adams, convicted of Riot, in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, at October Term, 1860, and sentenced to be confined in the Jail of Baltimore city, for the period of two years.

August 22nd.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of the application for Writ Habeas Corpus in the case of State vs. John Hinesly, indicted at the November Term, 1860, of the Criminal Court for Baltimore city

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the Pardon of Henry Brown, convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, at May Term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of five years.

August 23rd.

The Governor pardoned William F. Crookshanks, convicted in the Circuit Court for Charles County, at May Term, 1860, of assault with intent to kill, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of two years.

August 26th.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of George Bower, alias Timmer, convicted at the April Term, 1860, of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County.
