

1861.

August 27th.

The Governor pardoned Christina Hinkle, convicted of Larceny, at the August Term, 1859, of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of five years and eight months.

August 28th

The Governor issued a Warrant to the Sheriff of Cecil county, for the arrest and delivery to Samuel Waring, of a certain John Housen, a fugitive from Justice, of the State of Pennsylvania, and for whom a requisition had been made by the Governor of that State.

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of application for Habeas Corpus in the case of B. Welch Owens, indicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, at May Term, 1861, for riot on the 19th of April, 1861.

August 30th

The Governor granted a respite until Friday the 11th day of October, 1861, to Kerry Kennard, for whose execution on the 13th day of September, 1861, a Warrant had been issued.
