September 4.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for Nolle Prosequi in the case of Nathaniel Hickman, indicted at September Term, 1859, of the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, for Embezzlement.

On the same day the Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi to George Feigley, indicted in the Circuit Court for Washington County, for the crime of Larceny in six cases, in three of which Nolle Prosequis have already been granted; it having been the intention of the Governor to embrace all the cases in the first grant.

The Governor made a Requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the delivery to James E. Oldham, of a certain John F. Catchell, a fugitive from justice of this State.

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of Philip Crowley, convicted in the Criminal Court of Baltimore city, at May Term, 1858, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of six years.

On the same day the Governor made a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the delivery to James E. Oldham of a certain Thomas Hill, a fugitive from justice of this State.

On the same day the Governor issued a Warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany county for the delivery to William Huston, of a certain Peter Zimmerman, alias Jacob Snyder, a fugitive from justice of the State of Pennsylvania.
