October 4.

The Governor remitted the fine of Fifty dollars imposed upon James E. Cassidy by the Circuit Court for Howard county at March Term, 1860, for assault and battery.

On the same day the Governor remitted the fine of Five Dollars imposed upon John Bramblett by the Circuit Court for Howard county, at September Term, 1861, for breaking down a door, &c.

On the same day the Governor granted a further respite, until Friday the 22nd day of November, 1861, to Perry Kenward, a Warrant for whose execution on the 11th day of October, 1861, had heretofore been issued.
