October 8.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of George Lorman convicted in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county, at April Term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of Ten years.

On the same day the Governor issued a Warrant to the Sheriff of Washington county for the arrest and delivery, to William McGrath, of a certain Jacob Perry, a fugitive from the justice of the State of Pennsylvania.

On the same day, the Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of George D. Ford, convicted in the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county at April Term, 1860, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of Eighteen months.

October 9.

The Governor granted License to the President, Managers and Company of the Frederick and Emmittsburg Turnpike company, to fix the necessary toll gates upon a certain portion of said Road therein mentioned.

October 12.

The Governor remitted the fine of Twenty-Five Dollars which was imposed upon Noah Coleman by J. B. Wheat, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland in and for the city of Baltimore, for selling without License.

October 15.

The Governor remitted the fine of One Hundred Dollars imposed upon Joseph Shiller by the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at May Term, 1861.
