

1861.

Philip Mason, convicted at January Term, 1856, of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the period of Eight years and five months.

October 29.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for *Volle Prosequi* in the case of John Williams, indicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at September Term, 1861, for Larceny.

November 5.

The Governor remitted the fine of twenty-five dollars which was imposed upon P. Weigant, by J. W. Bumsing, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Baltimore city, for peddling without License.

November 12.

The Governor ordered publication of the application for the pardon of Adam Link, convicted in the Circuit Court for Howard county, at March Term, 1859, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for five years and three months.

On the same day the Governor remitted the fine of one thousand dollars imposed upon Philip Leakley, by the Criminal Court of Baltimore, at September Term, 1861, for assault with intent to murder.

On the same day the Governor remitted one half of the fine imposed upon Sophia M. Carr, by the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at September Term, 1861, for selling a lottery ticket, contrary to law.
