November 13.

The Governor ordered notice to be given of application for the pardon of Thomas Ray, convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore city, at September Term, 1861, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of two years.

On the same day the Governor remitted the fine of Ten dollars imposed upon William Keller, by William Hawkins, a Justice of the Peace of the State of Maryland, in and for Anne Arundel county, for running a ferry boat without a License.

November 15.

The Governor issued his Proclamation declaring that Edward Shriver, of the First District, and Frederick Fickey, jr., of the Third District, were duly elected Commissioners of Public Works for said districts, at the election held on the 6th of November, 1861.

On the same day the Governor ordered notice to be given of an application for tolle Prosequi in the case of Simon W. Boyer, jr., indicted in the Circuit Court for Kent county, at October Term, 1861, for assault and battery.

November 16.

The Governor issued the following Proclamation:
