November 18.

The Governor remitted the fine of Fifty Dollars imposed upon Henry C. Bell by the Circuit Court for Frederick county, at February Term, 1861, for selling liquor in quantities less than a pint without license for so doing.

November 19.

The Governor accepted the resignation of Hon. Grayson Eichelberger, as Secretary of State, which was tendered in consequence of his election as State Senator for Frederick county.

On the same day the Governor appointed Thomas J. Wilson Secretary of State, who thereupon duly qualified as such by taking and subscribing the oath prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the State of Maryland.

November 20.

The Governor pardoned Charles Coulson convicted in the Criminal Court for Baltimore, at January Term, 1857, of manslaughter, and sentenced to the Penitentiary until the 23rd day of June, 1862.

On the same day the Governor granted a full Pardon to John Williams charged by the Grand Jury of Baltimore city with being a rogue and a vagabond.

November 21.

The Governor pardoned William N. Hall, convicted of Larceny, in the Circuit Court for Prince George's county, at November Term, 1858, and sentenced to the Penitentiary for the term of three years and six months.
